 Respectful of student efforts and invested in student achievement

Effective at communication

- Responds respectfully to students
- Is respectful of student concerns/questions
- Provides and follows clear and published methods of communication

Enthusiastic about teaching

- Passionate about subject and "passing the torch"
- Students, regardless of their course grade, evaluate teachers higher if they feel they have learned
